Víctor Beltrán Román comenzó sus estudios doctorales en 2021. Sus áreas de interés se vinculan al sistema de justicia criminal, enfocándose principalmente en policías y fiscales. Asimismo, se interesa por la litigación y temas probatorios, así como proceso penal comparado.

Víctor obtuvo su grado de Licenciado en Ciencias Jurídicas y Sociales en la Universidad Diego Portales (2018). Posteriormente, obtuvo el grado de Máster en Derecho en la Universidad de Wisconsin-Madison (2020). Mientras cursó su maestría, analizó la manera en que se gestó, condujo e implementó una importante reforma a la policía de Madison, Wisconsin mediante la cual se implementó un mecanismo de *civilian oversight* sobre la policía.

Previo a sus estudios doctorales, Víctor ocupó diversos puestos vinculados a área penal y procesal penal en Chile. En el extranjero, se desempeñó como *associate* en The Albarado Law Firm (Texas) y ocupó cargos de asistente legal y de investigación en Innocence Project (Idaho). Actualmente, Víctor se desempeña como profesor de Proceso Penal en la Escuela de Derecho de la Universidad Diego Portales.

Víctor obtained his bachelor's degree in Law and Social Sciences at Diego Portales University (2018). Subsequently, he earned a Master of Laws degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (2020). While pursuing his master's degree, he analyzed how a significant police reform in Madison, Wisconsin, was created, conducted, and implemented, by introducing a civilian oversight mechanism for the police.

Prior to his doctoral studies, Víctor held several positions on the field of criminal law and criminal procedure in Chile. Abroad, he worked as an associate at The Albarado Law Firm (Texas) and held legal assistant and research positions at the Innocence Project (Idaho). Currently, Víctor performs as a Criminal Procedure professor at Diego Portales School of Law.
